Dear Ms Duncan,

I refer to the request which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for access to records held by this Department, as follows:

"all correspondence between the Department of Foreign Affairs and the UK Electoral Commission relating to the Constitutional Research Council / CRC and / or its activities and / or its officers / directors. Please limit your search for relevant material from 1 June 2016 to present."

I refer also to the acknowledgement of your request which was sent to you on 3 November 2017.

As there are no records that match the above criteria, I have made a decision to refuse your request under section 15(1)a of the act, as follows:

Refusal on administrative grounds to grant FOI requests

- 15. (1) A head to whom an FOI request is made may refuse to grant the request where—
- (a) the record concerned does not exist or cannot be found after all reasonable steps to ascertain its whereabouts have been taken

Right of Appeal

You should make your appeal within 4 weeks (20 working days) from the date of this notification. However, the making of a late appeal may be permitted in appropriate

circumstances. The appeal will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of the staff of this Department.
