### Message from the Consul General

A chairde,

Our second Ministerial visit this St Patrick's Day season was a great success. Michael Ring, T.D., our Minister of State for Regional Economic Development, drew attention to the strong and reciprocal commercial relationship between Ireland and Georgia, underlined our commitment to our diaspora in the Southeast and supported IDA efforts to expand U.S. investment into Ireland.

He also spoke to our partners about the Government's BREXIT strategy, the priority we give to our bilateral relationship with Georgia and the significance of the Taoiseach's plans to give citizens abroad the right to vote for our President.

His meeting with Governor Deal, pictured above, was a highlight. The Governor tweeted afterwards "From yesterday's heritage to today's jobs, GA's connection with Ireland is as strong as ever....."

#### **Irish News**

The Taoiseach's St Patrick's Day visit the U.S. was a striking success. He had productive meetings with the President, Vice President, Speaker Ryan, Senate Minority Leader and business leaders and participated in a range of major events including the White House Reception, Vice President's Breakfast and speaker's lunch. Media coverage of the visit was prolific. Check out the speeches from the White House reception on YouTube or in print.

The Government issued a <u>Statement</u> on Theresa May's triggering of Article 50, which formally began the UK's two-year exit process. An overview of this process, and information on Ireland's Brexit strategy is available here.

In celebration of the EU's 60<sup>th</sup> birthday, a <u>Declaration</u> was jointly issued from Rome by the leaders of 27 member states, the European Council, the European Parliament and the European Commission reaffirming their commitment to a "Union that is safe and secure, prosperous, competitive, sustainable and socially responsible, and with the will and capacity of playing a key role in the world and of shaping globalisation."

Ireland's economic recovery is firmly established, with all key economic indicators pointing to continued solid growth, despite a challenging regional and global environment. The economy expanded 5.2% in 2016, and the unemployment rate has fallen below 6.6%, down from a peak of over 15% in 2012.

On March 30<sup>th</sup>, the Minister Charlie Flanagan launched the new <u>Online Passport Application Service</u>, which will allow citizens over 18 years of age to process passport renewals online.

The Taoiseach announced that the Government has decided to hold <u>a referendum to amend the Constitution</u> to allow Irish citizens resident outside the State, including in Northern Ireland, to vote in Irish presidential elections.

An estimated half million people lined the streets of Dublin for its spectacular 2017 St. Patrick's Day Parade, the highlight of a 4-day Festival, led by Irish sailor and Olympic silver medalist Annalise Murphy as Grand Marshall. RTE News provided a colorful retrospective of St. Patrick's Day festivities around the world.

During his St. Patrick's Day visit to the U.S., <u>Taoiseach Enda Kenny launched</u> the new <u>Ireland.ie</u> portal, an initiative of the five-year <u>Creative Ireland Programme</u> which places culture and creativity at the centre of public policy. Also recently announced were details of Cruinniú na Cásca, a <u>national day of culture and creativity</u>, which will take place on Easter Monday in Dublin and in every county nationwide.

In a statement of condolence on the <u>death of Sinn Fein's Martin McGuiness</u>, a key architect of the Good Friday Agreement, the Taoiseach said "his passing represents a significant loss, not only to politics in Northern Ireland but to the wider political landscape on this island and beyond."

Minister Flanagan extended condolences to the people of London following the <u>Westminster attack</u> and confirmed that one Irish person was amongst those injured.

Ireland is ranked first in the world for finance skills and third in the world for company and workforce productivity, with Irish labor productivity almost 35% above the EU 27 average.

In the last two months, two additional U.S. southeast tech companies announced investments into Ireland with Atlanta-based financial tech company <u>Kabbage</u> basing its new European headquarters in Dublin, and Raleigh software multinational, <u>Red Hat</u>, expanding to Waterford where it will create 60 jobs.

The Taoiseach, together with Ministers Flanagan, O'Connor and Ross, launched new trade strategy, <u>Ireland Connected</u>: Trading and Investing in a Dynamic World - targeting €26 billion in annual indigenous exports by 2020.

In Atlanta, Consul General Stephens was pleased to chat with Lois Reitzes, the host of WABE radio's "City Lights", about the Irish Government's Creative Ireland initiative, St. Patricks Day and how it is celebrated in Atlanta. Irish Executive Chef Thomas McKeown, from the Hyatt Regency Atlanta, celebrated Irish food and drink with a St Patrick's Day broadcast on Fox 5 Atlanta supported by the Consulate and Bord Bia.

Congratulations to Atlanta based Jacinta King O' Sullivan, Loughrea native and director of the King O' Sullivan School of Irish Dance, who has been invited to judge the World Irish Dance Championships in Dublin in 2017, a recognition of the growth and development of Irish Dance in the South in recent years.
