

After this newsletter's summer break, we are back to full speed.

Ireland's new Ambassador to the United States, Dan Mulhall, will travel to Miami next week to mark Aer Lingus's first ever scheduled service between Dublin and Miami, announce the new Honorary Consul of Ireland in Miami and open the U.S. premier of The Irish in Latin America exhibition.

The Consulate General is also joining forces with Aer Lingus to sponsor lectures by Irish academic Tim Fanning on Ireland's historic ties to Latin America at the Mexican Cultural Institute in Miami and Miami International Airport.

The Taoiseach, Leo Varadkar, has already tweeted his backing for the new route "...More good news on our increasing air connectivity..." He blazed a trail for our upgraded relationship with Miami during his visit as Minister for Transport and Tourism in March 2014.

We welcome the appointment of <u>Ireland's new Ambassador</u> to the United States, <u>Dan Mulhall</u>.

Taoiseach Leo Varadkar announced Government plans to <u>double Ireland's global footprint</u> by 2025 so as to attract increased investment in Ireland, boost tourism and trade, build stronger links with our diaspora and increase cultural exchange.

The Taoiseach also held bilateral meetings with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau in Ireland and on a <u>recent visit</u> to <u>Canada</u> where they discussed CETA, Brexit, NAFTA, and health services among other issues.

The Government has been working continually on Brexit issues this summer in support of the EU European Commission negotiators and though high level meetings, public engagements and studies.

We <u>welcomed</u> the publication of the UK's position paper on Northern Ireland and Ireland in the context of the Brexit negotiation process. The Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade, Mr. Simon Coveney TD, met with the UK <u>Chancellor of the Exchequer</u> and <u>Secretary of State for Northern Ireland</u> and also addressed the <u>Northern Ireland</u> Chamber of Commerce, underlining that the withdrawal agreement should provide continued EU support to the NI peace process and to the future development of the region.

The Tánaiste and Minister for Business, Enterprise and Innovation, Frances Fitzgerald Commissioned a major study of global trade opportunities to help Irish business expand abroad and face challenge of Brexit.

Ireland's economic recovery is continuing at a robust pace, with employment at its highest level since 2008, the cost of borrowing close to historic lows, and estimated real GDP growth of 4.3% for 2017.

The Government published its <u>National Risk Assessment 2017 – Overview of Strategic Risks</u> to ensure a broad-based and inclusive debate on the risks facing the country and to assist in ensuring appropriate prevention and mitigation measures are introduced as needed.

The Government has also announced plans to identify and develop solutions to barriers faced by <u>returning</u> <u>emigrants to Ireland</u>.

The Minister for Rural and Community Development, Michael Ring TD, welcomed the inclusion of <u>the Wild Atlantic Way</u> on the Lonely Planet's list of the world's greatest drives, while also acknowledging significant work still to be done in order to fully realise the potential of the project.

The Minister for Communications, Climate Action and Environment, Denis Naughten designated the <u>All-Ireland Senior Ladies Gaelic Football and Camogie Final</u> as 'events of major importance to society', which will ensure that these events remain available on a Free-to-Air and live basis for Irish television viewers.

The Minister for Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht, Heather Humphreys TD, announced €625,000 in funding from <u>Culture Ireland</u>, which will allow 117 Irish artists and arts organisations to present their work worldwide in 2017 and 2018. This funding will bring great Irish music, theatre and art to venues across the Southeast, including Atlanta, Nashville, Charleston and Miami-Dade County.
