## News about Ireland

The Minister for Finance, Michael Noonan, and Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, Brendan Howlin, delivered the Government's <u>Spring Economic Statement</u>, which outlined the approach to be taken to create jobs, sustain growth and invest in services between 2015 and 2020. Ireland's economy is forecast to grow by 4% this year, which would likely see Ireland again enjoying the fastest growth in the European Union.

Ambassador Anderson was interviewed during her visit to Charlotte by Chris William for the "<u>Carolina Business Review</u>". The Ambassador answered questions on US immigration reform, comparisons between the US and Irish health systems, and Ireland's economic recovery.

<u>The Irish Times</u> examined the success of the Fadó Irish pub company, led in the US by Atlanta-based Kieran McGill.

Global Atlanta took a look at the resumption of direct daily Delta flights between Atlanta and Dublin.

Enterprise Ireland focused on "Irish entrepreneurs – the heroes of our economic recovery".

Registration is now open for the first <u>Global Irish Civic Forum</u> which will be held at Dublin Castle between June 3 and 5.

A new documentary "Gallipoli: Ireland's Forgotten Heroes" is now available on the RTÉ International Player to mark 100 years since a battle in which 3,000 Irishmen died. Meanwhile, Atlanta's Jon Kiger is leading a delegation of 100 visitors from the US to Cork, Ireland, for the centenary commemoration of the sinking of the Lusitania.

And voters in Ireland will have their say on two proposals in <u>referenda on Friday, May 22</u>. The questions posed will ask whether two people should be allowed to marry regardless of their gender and whether the age for candidates to contest an election to become President should be reduced from 35 to 21.
