Dear Ms. Halloran,

I refer to the request which you have made under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for records held by this Department in which you requested details relating to:

- A full inventory of the wine kept on-site in Iveagh House
- A full breakdown of the wines
- The values of each of the bottles in the wine collection
- A list of occasions when the wine was used

I refer also to the acknowledgement of your request which was sent to you on 16 November 2015.

I also note that you have withdrawn the last part of your request relating to the list of occasions on which the wine was used.

The Department holds a stock of wine for use in relation to State and Official hospitality. The stock facilitates provision of wines suitable for official events at a significant discount from the cost of purchasing them from caterers at the time they are required. In general, wine served at official functions costs less than €20 per bottle. In line with expenditure practices overall in the Department, the purchase of new stock is assessed carefully and kept under continuing review to ensure value for money.

I have identified 1 record that falls within the scope of your request. My decision in relation to the record is detailed in the schedule below.
