Dear Mr Healy,

I refer to the request which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for access to records held by this Department, as follows:

"I am seeking all records with the Department of Foreign Affairs in relation to subsistence/costs expenses claimed by Minister of State with responsibility for European Affairs Dara Murphy. The records I am seeking are from 2014 to date (November 2015)

I am seeking a full breakdown of subsistence costs claimed only by Mr. Murphy – as well as a grand total cost for 2014 and the cost for 2015 to date. "

I refer also to the acknowledgement of your request which was sent to you on 13th November, 2015.

I have identified I record that falls within the scope of your request. The records are listed in the schedule below. I have made a decision to grant all records.

As you will appreciate, the role of Minister of State at the Departments of the Taoiseach and Foreign Affairs and Trade with special Responsibility for European Affairs and Data Protection includes an obligation to undertake a significant amount of official travel overseas.

This Department is fully compliant with the Department of Finance guidelines on foreign travel. The Department also operates its own detailed internal travel guidelines and practices

which ensure cost effective travel, both in Headquarters and throughout our network of 80 diplomatic missions abroad.

The central aim of the Departmental travel policy, which applies to both Ministers and officials, is to minimise official travel costs and to achieve value for money for expenditure necessarily incurred, consistent with the effective discharge of official duties.

Ministerial mileage expenses are paid in accordance with rates and regulations set down by the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

Mileage expenses are a monthly total and reflect business related travel across Ireland during the respective month, and incorporate deductions for any personal-related travel.

Below is a summary table of subsistence and mileage by year as requested and attached is a detailed breakdown of these costs.
