Remember your passport!

Check that your passport is valid for the duration of your stay in France. Scan a copy of it and email it to yourself and a family member at home.

Get a new Passport Card at dfa.ie/passport. This is valid for travel within Europe and can fit in your wallet, allowing you to leave your passport in a safe place.

European Health Insurance Card

Make sure you have your European Health Insurance Card. If you don't have one yet, visit ehic.ie for more details.

REGISTER



Registering with the Embassy is quick, simple and secure and will help us contact you or your family in an emergency. You can register through dfa.ie/travel

INSURANCE



Stuff happens; get travel insurance. It will save you and your family a lot of money if something goes wrong.

FOLLOW THE RULES



A state of emergency is in force in France. This means there may be long queues for public transport, stadiums, and Fanzones. Carry photo ID at all times and follow the instructions of tournament officials.

BE RESPONSIBLE



Avoid unnecessary risks – steer clear of trouble, drink responsibly and be respectful when engaging with local authorities.

Let your family and friends know that you're ok and ensure they have your travel plans.
