

**TRAVEL ADVICE FOR FANS ATTENDING
LUXEMBOURG -V- REPUBLIC OF IRELAND,
2022 WORLD CUP QUALIFYING MATCH AT 20.45HRS ON
14 NOVEMBER 2021 AT STADE DE LUXEMBOURG**

On Sunday, 14th November 2021, the Republic of Ireland will play Luxembourg in the 2022 World Cup Qualifying Match at Stade de Luxembourg in Luxembourg City.

This page is intended as an advisory for Irish citizens who are travelling to Luxembourg for this match.

Know Before You Go: Travel Tips

- CovidCheck measures will be in place and supporters must be able to show that they are either fully vaccinated or can present a certified negative PCR/Antigen test result (with a QR code).
- Travel with your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) which can be applied for through the HSE.
- You should carry a form of photo identification at all times. Make sure you have copies of your passport, passport card and other ID in case you lose it.
- Fill in the emergency contact details page on your passport.
- Keep your valuables in a safe place.
- Keep a bank card and some cash separate from the rest of your valuables and avoid carrying too many valuables with you.
- Beware of pick pockets at train stations, airports, in crowds, restaurants, cafés, on public transport, near ATMs and never leave your bag or belongings out of sight or unattended.
- Let people know where you are and make sure you know where your friends are.
- Travel well in advance to the stadium. The match begins at 20.45.

Transportation

The Stadium is located in the southern part of Luxembourg City and can be reached via Boulevard de Kockelscheuer. It is easily accessible by public transport, as well as by car.

Public transportation is free in Luxembourg.

By Bus: Routes 5, 18 and 22 serve the Stadium ([Network and maps | Ville de Luxembourg \(vdl.lu\)](#))

By Car: Stade de Luxembourg is located close to the Croix de Gasperich interchange and can be reached from the A1, A3, A4 and A6 motorways.



Security

You should exercise caution in large gatherings; be careful with your personal belongings, remain calm in crowds, respect the crowd restrictions at some locations and follow the instructions of the local authorities and the event organisers. Please

be aware that, while crime rates are low in Luxembourg, pick pockets may target this event.

To Remember

Local currency is the Euro. While Irish debit and credit cards can usually be used, you should be aware of potential charges.

Luxembourg electrical sockets are type F – two round pin sockets, so you may need to pack an adapter in order to charge electrical items.

Lost/Stolen Passport

If your Irish passport is lost or stolen, please contact the Embassy of Ireland. If necessary, the Embassy can issue an emergency travel document to get you home.

Required Documentation

- Completed passport application form;
- Two printed passport photographs & one digital;
- Copy of lost / stolen passport if possible
- Any other ID available;
- Police report of loss / theft; (find closest police station at: <https://police.public.lu/en/votre-police/postes-police.html>)
- Proof of travel arrangements.
- Fee of €30 to be paid in cash.

Additionally for under-18s

- Consent from legal guardian(s)
- Photo ID of guardians
