

# St Patrick's Day 2016 and Casement Events

The Embassy organised a series of commemorative events relating to the legacy of Roger Casement in Brasilia and Manaus. These events, funded by the Ireland 2016 Fund, included a play in Portuguese on Casement in Brasilia, and a seminar and exhibition at the CCBB in Brasilia and at the Federal University in Manaus. The Portuguese translation of Casement's Amazon Diaries was also launched at events in the University of São Paulo. The events received significant traction on twitter in Ireland with the use of 1916-related hashtags. The Brasilia seminar was addressed by Casement's cousin, Susan, who grew up in Magherintemple and is a long-time resident of Brazil. The British Ambassador also spoke briefly and eloquently of the changed circumstances in the bilateral relationship.

An exhibition on artefacts and knowledge of indigenous peoples at the Casa do Maranhão in São Luís featured a panel in homage to Roger Casement and runs until 6 May. More details are available at: <u>https://t.co/HX7NYhY650</u>
