Athbheochán na Gaeilge agus Éirí Amach na Cásca

The Revival of the Irish Language and the Easter Rising

The exhibition "The Revival of the Irish Language and the Easter Rising" is one of Conradh na Gaeilge's (the Gaelic League) contributions to the Irish Government's Centenary programme. It provides an opportunity to reflect on and reappraise the momentous events which led to the partition of 20th century Ireland and to the foundation of the Republic of Ireland.

This exhibition highlights the activities of Irish cultural activists since the foundation of the Gaelic League in 1893 and their involvement in the social and political movements which triggered the Rising in 1916 and led to the subsequent War of Independence.

A brief introductory lecture on the social and cultural background of the times will be given in German by Mr. Pádhraic Ó Dochartaigh, correspondent in Germany for Raidió na Gaeltachta and the Irish language service of RTÉ Radio. Chuir Chonradh na Gaeilge an taispeántas "Athbheochan na Gaeilge agus Éirí Amach na Cásca" ar fáil mar chuid de chlár comórtha céad bliain Rialtas na hÉireann. Tugann sé deis dúinn machnamh agus athbhreithniú a dhéanamh ar na himeachtaí tromchúiseacha as ar tháinig críochdheighilt na hÉireann sa 20ú Aois agus bunú Phoblacht na hÉireann fhéin.

Díríonn an taispeántas seo ar obair ghníomhairí cultúrtha ó bunaíodh Conradh na Gaeilge sa mbliain 1893 agus ar an mbaint a bhí acu leis na gluaiseachtaí sóisialta, agus polaitiúla a ghlac páirt san Éirí Amach sa mbliain 1916 agus i gCogadh na Saoirse ina dhiaidh sin.

Shebeen Flick Irish Film Festival 2017

Festival to open with HISTORY'S FUTURE starring Mark O'Halloran and Oscar[®] winner STUTTERER

Actor Mark O'Halloran to attend the opening

The 2017 edition of Shebeen Flick - Irish Film Festival Berlin, which will take place from March 16th to the 19th, will open with the German premiere of the Irish co-production HISTORY'S FUTURE (2016) by Fiona Tan, starring Mark O'Halloran (ADAM & PAUL, CALVARY) as the nameless main character of the story. The film will be preceded by the Academy Award winner for Best Live Action Short 2016: STUTTERER (Ben Cleary, 2015).

The opening will take place on Thursday, March 16th at 8pm at Kino Moviemento in attendance of O'Halloran. This year, the festival will screen a total of 25 films (feature-length and shorts), which is more than double the amount from last year. Part fiction, part documentary, part speculative essay on the contemporary world, **HISTORY'S FUTURE is about one man's odyssey through a Europe in turmoil** – and through his own mind. Losing his memory after a mugging, a man known only as 'MP' (Missing Person) leaves his home and sets out on a journey – in search not only for his memory but perhaps also for a new identity. On his travels from country to country, MP attempts to gain insight into the complexity of life in the 21st-century West – into what commentators have called an age of 'rolling catastrophe'. In **STUTTERER** an online relationship has helped a lonely typographer mask his cruel speech impediment. Now he is faced with the daunting prospect of finally bringing that relationship into the real world.

"We are very honoured to open the festival with HISTORY'S FUTURE and to have Mark O'Halloran joining us in Berlin. The film is a stunning piece of art and also of incredible relevance to the times we live in, both culturally and politically. We hope that by starting the festival with this film, we will set the tone for this year's programme, which is aiming to capture today's zeitgeist." Another highlight of the festival is **the documentary MATTRESS MEN** (Colm Quinn, 2016), winner of the Dublin Film Critics Circle Awards 2016. In an attempt to save his struggling mattress selling business, sixty-something Michael Flynn reinvents himself as the eccentric online persona 'Mattress Mick', under the guidance of his good friend Paul Kelly. As business begins to grow, their friendship starts to implode.

Earlier this month, the festival already <u>announced</u> the closing film **A DATE FOR MAD MARY** (2015, directed by Darren Thornton, who is also attending the festival) and **THE QUEEN OF IRELAND** (2015) by Conor Horgan about the LGBT activist drag queen Panti Bliss (Rory O'Neill).

But her attempts at dating are a disaster and she winds up feeling more alone... until she meets Jess and everything changes. A Date for Mad Mary is a tough and tender story about friendship, first love, and letting go of the glory days. A finely crafted Irish dramedy that packs an emotional punch and richly funny in places.






The national holiday of Ireland, St. Patrick's Day – with its lively atmosphere, the relevant drinks and food and above all Irish folk music – has been celebrated in our circles on the 17th March in and the days around it for a long time.

Pat McDonnell will be arriving exclusively from Ireland to join us here in Germany for the celebrations.

The singer, guitarist, flutist, composer and songwriter lives in the city of Galway, on Ireland's west coast. Pat is very much in demand as a session, studio and band musician in Ireland. He has a masterful understanding of breathtakingly, lively traditional instrumental songs on the flute, as well as emotion filled ballads both in English and Irish (Gaelic).

Appropriate to the occasion of St. Patrick's Day, Pat will have a wide range of sing-alongs and songs you can join in on in his set list. For Irish musicians, fun and lively contact with their audience is an important motivating factor for their playing.

Harald Jüngst, a bodhrán player who has already released ten albums in Germany with the traditional Irish folk band *Sheevón*, plays in an Irish based quintet, *Fior Uisce*.

Harald will be accompanying Pat with his bodhrán, an Irish percussion instrument made of wood.

Otto Kruppa is a master of stringed instruments, including guitar, mandolin and Bouzouki.

Ina Tomec completes the group with her harmonies in the quartet.

Mendelssohn Symphony No. 5 in D, Op. 107 Reformation

Mozart's *Don Giovanni Overture* suggests an impending tragedy, but the music makes an emotional u-turn into something quite magnificent. It counter-balances the powerful close of **Mendelssohn**'s *Reformation Symphony* (No. 5), a work written to commemorate the 300th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation that affords an instructive insight into the composer's use of Lutheran church music.

Mozart's piano concertos are some of his greatest works. His wildly popular Concerto No.21 was written by the twenty-nine-year old Mozart, six years before his early death. By virtue of its slow movement, this work has become one of the most recorded of Mozart's concertos ever since featuring in the 1967 film, *Elvira Madigan*. **Mozart**'s C major Fugue was first composed for two pianos, but the composer later re-arranged it for strings, adding an introductory Adagio reminiscent of a French overture.

Widmann brings his own twist to the *Andante* from **Mendelssohn**'s *Clarinet & Piano Sonata*, which he has arranged for Clarinet, String Orchestra and Celesta – featuring **Widmann** on Clarinet and Levit exchanging the Grand Piano for the Celesta.

Moya Brennan - River of Songs Tour

The U2 singer Bono has said that Moya Brennan "has one of the greatest voices ever heard by the human ear". As the voice of the Celtic cult band *Clannad*, she has sold more than 20 million albums since 1975. Alongside this, she has achieved success in her solo career and in the duo *Voices and Harps* with Cormac de Barra. The exceptional Irish artist is known worldwide for her sensual and expressive voice, which has already bewitched musicians such as Paul Young, Ronan Keating, Schiller and other great names. She has even performed for Pope John Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI. As a singer with the band *Clannad*, Moya Brennan has already been nominated for a Grammy five times, and she won the coveted award with "Landmarks" in 1997. Two of her numerous solo albums were also nominated for a Grammy.



Moya touches with her magical melodies and deep lyrics which she uses to create an entirely new soundscape. The album with the same name as the tour ("River of Songs") will soon be available.

IRISH FOLK MUSIC

In 2017, Irish Spring, with the help of entertaining artists is set to further explore the cosmic sounds of Celtic music, thus strengthening our view into the homeland of Irish folk music. In its 17th year, artists are the focal point, dedicating themselves to the fusion of traditional and modern. They learn from the treasures of the past and thus seek to create what is to come. It is fascinating how many young musicians are giving traditional music a future. They captivate with their jigs, reels and hornpipes – the typical dances that one knows and loves from Irish music. These are accompanied by traditionally sung ballads and in the form of ever evolving and regenerating Irish folk-pop music. Besides singing, 2017 focuses on instruments such as the uilleann pipes (an Irish version of the Scottish bagpipes), the Celtic harp, the fiddle, accordion, guitar, tin whistles and wooden flutes. The combination of these three groups will be experienced in Germany for the first time and will have their most recent CDs packed with them in their bags. As always, a rousing solo dancer will send sparks flying on the stage as he dances the night away.

These three sisters are planning to conquer the world!

Karen (fiddle, vocals), Lorna (vocals, accordion) and Joleen McLaughlin (harp, piano, vocals) have already been known as "The Henry Girls" for a while in their hometown of Malin, a picturesque small town on the Inishowen peninsula in Northern Donegal.

The Henry Girls have come to be considered as one of the new ground-breaking folk groups in Ireland with their own personal style. In addition to world-wide concerts and countless TV and radio shows, they have also worked with stars such as Donal Lunny, Mary Black and Moya Brennan and have written entire soundtracks for films and theatre shows. They came to Germany for the first time in 2012 for their Irish Spring Festival Tour and quickly became audience favourites. In 2016, they began their third tour of Germany and Switzerland under their own name.

Their stage programme sees them travel in both directions across the sea and fish in open waters: New Folk, Bluegrass, Pop, Irish traditional music, ballads, but the influence of the swinging Andrew Sisters of the 30s, Crosby Stills & Nash and the Dixie Chicks can still be heard. The complex and intense three-voice vocal harmony is typical and rather un-Irish, and the intensity of the skilfully tuned vocal harmonies will give you goosebumps in a way which only three siblings connected by their common paths in life can. For their current tour in Germany, they are preparing a sound journey from the stormy and harsh northernmost cliffs of Ireland to the glittering night-time New York, and from the blues-soaked Memphis to the wistful sounds of Celtic emigrants in the mountainous south-eastern USA.
