The following documents should be submitted when applying for an Atypical Working Scheme Nurse visa;

- 1. Visa application form duly completed and signed by applicant
- 2. Original passport plus previous passport/s if applicable
- 3. 2 Passport size photographs
- 4. Work Permit / Atypical Working Scheme letter of Approval from Dept. of Justice
- 5. Registration Certificate from Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland
- 6. Adaption letter or correspondence from the relevant organisation detailing your exam date
- 7. Offer letter from Employer plus contract of Employment
- 8. English Language Certificate IELTS
- 9. CV detailing full educational and employment history
- 10. Educational certificates including Registration Certificate from Indian Nursing Board
- 11. Reference letter(s) from previous employers
- 12. Police Clearance Certificate
- 13. Details of Spouse and Children if applicable
- 14. Details of family member living in Ireland, UK and Europe if applicable
- 15. Previous visa refusals should be disclosed. The refusal letter from the relevant country and explanation should be submitted

- Originals and copies (legible) of all documents is required
