New Diaspora Strategy Launched

A quote from Article 2 of Ireland's Constitution, Bunreacht na hÉireann, is printed in every Irish passport: "the Irish nation cherishes its special affinity with people of Irish ancestry living abroad who share its cultural identity and heritage". This gives some indication of the continuing importance of the global Irish diaspora to modern Irish life.

The recent launch of <u>Global Ireland: Ireland's Diaspora Strategy 2020-2025</u> was an opportunity to reflect on how this diaspora is changing. Central to the new Strategy is a new, more inclusive understanding of who counts as 'Global Irish', that aims to reflect the diversity and complexity not just of modern Ireland, but of the contemporary diaspora as well. This is reflected in commitments to support those whose voices have traditionally been underrepresented in Irish diaspora policy, among them LGBTQ people, Irish people of mixed heritage and the Travelling community.

A central pillar of Ireland's diaspora policy was

and remains the Emigrant Support Programme. Since 2004, the ESP has disbursed over €180 million in funding to Irish community groups including groups in Louisiana, Colorado and Texas. As we move to the end of an unusual and challenging year, it is clear that Ireland's relationship with its diaspora matters more than ever.

The History of Irish in New Mexico


These are just a few of the notable Irish who made their way west .. Acknowledging their Irish heritage does not equate to endorsing some of their actions but does help us understand more fully the Irish story in New Mexico and the US.

It's sometimes surprising to other US

citizens to learn that New Mexico is actually IN the United States, and not still part of Mexico. (Stories abound of people being asked if they need a visa to travel here.) Definitely part of the US (it became a state in 1912), New Mexico saw its share of settlers from other countries, especially in the 1800s, when the Civil War brought the military (many

of whom were newly arrived Irish soldiers) and when the railroad brought many workers (many of them Irish as well).

At the outset of the Mexican-American War in 1846, a general named Stephen Watts Kearney (1794-1848) marched to Santa Fe at the head of a force of 1,700. Kearney was born into a family whose ancestors primarily came from Ireland (where the name was O'Kearny). Kearney's troops easily took control of the area and he was named its military governor on August 18, 1846.

William Bonney, AKA Billy the Kid

A much more famous (or infamous) New Mexican of Irish heritage was of course, William Bonney, AKA Billy the Kid. There is general scholarly agreement that his parents were of Irish Catholic descent, although their names are in dispute: His mother was Catherine McCarty or perhaps Katherine McCarty Bonney and his father may have been William Bonney or Patrick Henry McCarty. Following the death of her husband Patrick, Catherine McCarty and her son (Billy had a brother, Joseph) moved to Indianapolis, Indiana, where she met William Henry Harrison Antrim. Catherine married Antrim on March 1, 1873, at the First Presbyterian Church in Santa Fe, New Mexico Territory. Shortly afterward, the family moved from Santa Fe to Silver City, New Mexico. Billy spent the rest of his notorious career in the southwest, most notably New Mexico, where he fought in the Lincoln Country Wars. He was killed by Sheriff Pat Garrett on July 14, 1881 and is buried in Fort Sumner NM




Georgia O'Keeffe

In the 19th century, New Mexico became a place attractive to artists, in particular Georgia O'Keeffe (1887-1986), whose

father was of Irish descent. In 1929, O'Keeffe travelled to Taos, NM, and fell in love with the light and the land, producing many of her most iconic art works there. You can visit her home and studio in Abiquiú, northern NM, and the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum in Santa Fe.

In the 20th century, the city of Albuquerque was blessed with the presence of Brother Mathias Barrett (1900-1990), a Catholic brother born in Waterford, Ireland. who founded the Little Brothers of the Good Shepherd in Albuquerque in 1951 and established the Good Shepherd Refuge, which opened its doors to the homeless and the poverty stricken. Every year (before his death at the age of 90 in 1990), the city celebrated St. Patrick's Day AND Brother Mathias' birthday two days before (March 15), with a gigantic Irish Corned Beef and Cabbage Dinner, where hundreds came to support the Good Shepherd, Brother Mathias, and the Irish. The annual dinner is still held every year (except for 2020).

Despite the fact that New Mexico is hot, dry, and mostly brown, while Ireland is cool, wet, and green, we Irish in NM cherish our Irish heritage with a few small modifications: Sometimes we add green chile to our Irish stew!
