There was a beautiful performance of traditional Irish and Welsh tunes by Ceri Rhys Matthews and piper Rick Lines of the South Wales Pipers; and the Comhaltas Cardiff Irish Session Club created a warm Irish welcome with their playing as guests were arriving. This year's Championship schedule will see the All-Ireland Hurling Final take place on July 17 with the All-Ireland Football Final one week later on July 24th, which is the 30th Sunday of the Year. The ladies' championships will begin on May 25 and June 11 for camogie and football respectively, with finals are scheduled to take place on July 31 and August 7.
