A new Finland Ireland Parliamentary Friendship Group has formed on 14 November in the Eduskunta (Finnish Parliament).

Led by Mr Joonas Könttä (Centre Party), the group has 12 members.

Chargé Eddie Brannigan and Emma McCarron had the honour to join Mr Könttä and fellow Eduskunta (Finnish parliament) members **Ms Eveliina Heinäluoma** (Social Democrats), and **Mr Matias Marttinen** (National Coalition Party), to launch the group.

During the inaugural meeting, the Embassy also gave a briefing to the MPs on Ireland-Finland relations – political, economic, cultural. Participants also discussed EU and global matters, and a possible work programme for FIPFG in 2020.


I was intrigued recently to meet **Finnish author Markus Ahonen.**

Based in Malahide, his novels are Medusa, Palava sydän (Burning Heart), Jäljet (tracks), Sydämenmurskajaiset (Heart-Crushing party), and Sieluttomat (The Soulless). He also has three short story collections.

Markus says he has drawn inspiration from Ireland for some of his work. His main protagonist,
Detective Constable
Markku Isakksson, has a sister living in Malahide.
And in one of his novels, 'Sydamenmurskaijaiset', much criminal investigation and action takes place in Blessington, Malahide and Cork.
