Dear All,

As we enter into the final days of February, Irish minds turn to plans for St. Patrick's Day. This year we are all doing things very differently. Here in Finland, the Finnish Irish Society and the Salo Irish Festival have turned their plans around and are going online.

In Ireland too, there is going to be a lot happening – and this year it will accessible for those of us far away. Just as a taster – the Late show will move to a Wednesday for the first time in its history, the St Patrick's Festival is online, and Ireland.ie is full of resources and excitement.

This year has been like no other. Perhaps most difficult has been the experience of so many in the global Irish family of being away from home for long periods without the prospect of the regular visits many of us are used to. In this, we might all reflect on St. Patrick who after all, was himself an involuntary migrant who took Ireland as his home.

Whatever your connection to Ireland - whether you are Irish in birth or at heart (or both) - I hope that in exploring the online resources and the activities and events here in Finland listed in this message you will find ways to bring Ireland closer.

We at the Embassy will be hoping to share some light-hearted social media material over St. Patrick's Day. If you and your family and friends are engaged in family-friendly fun, please do share with us. We'd love to see all that is going on around Finland!

On the wider context, we are at another difficult stage in the pandemic. As the Government of Finland has announced additional restrictions and preparations for the reintroduction of the Emergency Law, it is more important than ever to be aware of the existing restrictions and recommendations in your area.

The <u>Embassy website</u> contains information on the services we continue to provide and where to find relevant information for those who have absolutely essential reasons for travel.

On Tuesday 26 February, the Government of Ireland published an updated plan for managing the way through the pandemic – <u>The Path Ahead</u>. This details plans for careful reopening of certain sectors while Level 5 restrictions will remain for some time to come. The aim is to reopen society as soon and as safely as possible while also maintaining downward pressure on the virus.

The Taoiseach reiterated the Government's commitment to deliver as fast and as comprehensive a vaccination programme as possible and over 350,000 vaccine doses have already been administered. By the end of March it is expected that Ireland will have administered 1.25 million doses.

This means that Ireland, like Finland, is putting in the work for better times ahead.

I and everyone at the Embassy hopes for St Patrick's Days in the future when we come together in person and in the meantime that everyone finds a way to mark the occasion.

I wish you all a very Happy St. Patrick's Day – Lá Fhéile Padraig sona daoibh go léir.

20 Shots of Opera



Travel Advice

There is a Government Advisory in operation against all non-essential international travel. Advice about travelling to Finland is available <u>here</u>. We advise all Irish citizens when travelling abroad to remain vigilant and follow the instructions and advice from the local authorities. <u>The Finnish Border Guard</u> provides information on border restrictions for travellers entering Finland. <u>The Finnish Institute for</u> <u>Health and Welfare</u> provides guidance on health security measures. Information on testing for COVID-19 is also available on the <u>FINENTRY</u> service.

Visas

As part of the combined efforts to tackle COVID-19 and to ensure customer safety, the Department of Justice has taken the decision to temporarily cease accepting new visa applications. Certain priority/emergency cases will continue to be processed. For further information please see the website of <u>Immigration Service Delivery</u>.

Passports

The Passport Service has paused operations in line with the move to Level 5 of the Government's National Framework on Living with COVID-19. Passport Online is open to all applicants, including children, renewing their passports and those applying for their first passport who are resident in Ireland, UK, EU, EEA and Switzerland.
